

Florida State Statute 817.361
Resale of
Multiday or Multievent Tickets

Whoever offers for sale, sells, or transfers in connection with a commercial transaction, with or without consideration, any nontransferable ticket or other nontransferable medium designed for admission to more than one amusement location or other facility offering entertainment to the general public, or for admission for more than 1 day thereto, after said ticket or other medium has been used at least once for admission, is guilty of a misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083. A nontransferable ticket or other nontransferable medium is one on which is clearly printed the phrase: "Nontransferable; must be used by the same person on all days" or words of similar import. Upon conviction for a second or subsequent violation of this subsection, such person is guilty of a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.

**How to Avoid
Theme Park
TICKET
SCAMS**



Chances are, as a tourist, you have noticed the many billboards, signs, and booths near Orlando's theme parks advertising discounted attraction tickets. It is important to know that some of these businesses are legitimate while others are violating the law and taking advantage of you.



Here are some factors to consider when inquiring about discounted tickets:

1. It is a misdemeanor crime for anyone to sell or transfer any used multi-day theme park or event ticket.
2. Most legitimate businesses will offer free or discounted tickets as an incentive to tour their property or attend an informational meeting in reference to timeshare sales. You generally do not receive the tickets until *after* you attend. The tickets you receive should be new, *not* used.
3. If you are asked for any type of deposit refundable upon return of the used ticket, it is *not* a valid ticket.
4. If the ticket appears used or the seller gives you any kind of "script" or instructions on what to say if the ticket is questioned at the park entrance, it is *not* a valid ticket.
5. Theme parks will refuse entry if they suspect the ticket is used or fraudulent. As a result, they *will not* refund your money.

Do not let your dream vacation become a nightmare by being turned away at the theme park gate!
