Parking Enforcement Unit

The Parking Enforcement Unit originally started as the Volunteer Community on Patrol (VCOB) program in 1994 at the direction of Sheriff Beary to provide the citizens of Orange County highly trained volunteer parking enforcement officers to enforce the parking laws of Orange County and to assist in other special details.

The duties of the Parking Enforcement Unit are designed to assist the agency by taking complaints that do not require a deputy to respond. These complaints can be reassigned to the parking enforcement officer(s) on duty. This allows the deputy sheriff to provide the citizens of Orange County with better service while insuring that the parking laws are being enforced. The parking enforcement officer may also be called upon to assist in many other situations when directed by a deputy sheriff as allowed under our guidelines.

QUALIFICATIONS

- ◆ Minimum age - 21 years old
- ◆ Possess a valid Florida driver's license
- ◆ Successfully complete a background investigation, driver's license investigation, voice stress analysis, and medical examination
- ◆ Must not have used any controlled substance except under the direction of a doctor **and** must have a medical release from a doctor
- ◆ Be able to work a **minimum** of 20 hours each month for the unit
- ◆ Attend monthly training.

Training

Parking enforcement volunteers must be able to attend the Parking Enforcement Academy course consisting of 16 hours of classroom and successfully complete field training.

Classroom training consists of public relations, basic first aid, CPR, traffic control, radio communications, courtroom procedures, ticket writing, legal issues and more.

Parking Enforcement Officer (PEO) Duties

PEO's serve as volunteers within our agency, performing a wide range of tasks while on active duty. The following are some of the duties you might be called upon to perform:

- ◆ Public Relations
- ◆ Assisting Motorists
- ◆ Issuing Citations
- ◆ Parking Complaints
- ◆ Tow Abandoned Vehicles
- ◆ School Crossings
- ◆ Traffic Control at Accident Scenes
- ◆ Traffic Control at Intersections
- ◆ Funeral Escorts
- ◆ VIP Escorts
- ◆ Assistance at Speed Check Points
(*Radar and Laser Details*)
- ◆ Assist at D.U.I. Checkpoints
- ◆ Assisting Other Agencies
- ◆ Disaster Assistance: hurricane, tornado, flood, fire
