OCSO Outdoor Firing Range Berm Maintenance and Cleaning

- Who is the incumbent and what is the current contract value?

(Recoil, LLC & \$26,326.35 was the last pricing on file, not a contract/based on a proposal for pricing from 2021-2022.)

- Please clarify: “complete a top toss and churn of the ballistic loose-fill rubber mulch”

(See Bid: Section entitled “Annual Clean”; Annual Berm and Loose-Fill Rubber Maintenance (Year 2,4,6), subsection 1-5. See pages 12-15 for Annual Clean and 14-15 for information related to a major cleaning (Year 1,3,5).

- How much brass is currently on site? How is it stored? Is it palletized?

(The brass is stored in palletized open-top shaped boxes at the range. Currently the weight of it is unsure and the brass is not included in the vendor's scope of work.)

- How many drums should Contractor expect to provide/replace at each service visit?

(In 2024 there were 11 drums used for the annual clean that was completed and in 2021 during a major cleaning there were 41 drums used.)

- Please clarify how the lead and brass recycling credit will be managed: *Lead will be recycled and used as partial payment for work completed or credited back to OCSO.* Bidder suggests a 50/50 split of the credit between County and Contractor.

(Please reference page 68 of Bid documents, “Lead will be recycled and used as partial payment for work completed or credited back to OCSO” This answer only speaks to lead only and there will no brass included.)

- When was the last service and how much lead was recovered? Please provide any available historical data on lead recovery history / quantities recovered as well as brass quantities.

(The last service was completed approximately in December 2024 which was an Annual Clean. The amount of lead recovered was 16 tons in the north and shot gun pits. The length of time between cleanings, and the number of trainings completed should be considered when trying to formulate an exact number.)

- Please clarify the differences between Major Cleanout and Annual Cleanout, both appear to include lead recovery in the scope, however it is not reflected on the pricing table for the Annual Cleanout to account for recycling credit.

(Please see page 27 of bid document for Major Cleanout (Exhibit A-8a), Annual Cleanout, see page 28 (Exhibit A-8b).

- Please clarify how the County would like the below three (3) items addressed on Attachment A
 - Lead Recycling Credit*
 - Estimated Recovered Lead:
 - Recycling value: Per Pound

(Bidders are to propose their responses)

- Are the Estimated Recovered Lead & Recycling value: Per Pound line items an estimate, or will Contractor be held to these numbers? Bidder suggests County provide the estimated lead recovered number for comparison purposes.

(Pricing is based on estimated quantities; final invoice will reflect actual volumes processed. Scrap Metal credits will be applied to reduce the total project costs. Recycling credit rates are based on London Metal Exchange. (<http://www.lme.com/Metals/Non-ferrous/LME-Lead#Summary>))

- Is the lead recovery on the rifle range to be included? If yes, please provide the berm dimensions (l x w x h)

(The rifle range/shotgun pit is approximately 28 x 24 x 12 approximately.)

- Please provide any historical data available on quantities of waste generated during past services.

(Total tons of waste disposed of hazardous and non-hazardous)

(2024 – non-hazardous waste rubber and debris 16 tons)

(Total tons of lead recovered and recycled) 2024 – (R. Range/Shotgun Pit 23,547 lbs)

(2021 – East/West 70.084 lbs North/Shotgun 28.891 lbs)

- Please clarify: Repairs may be needed during the Major Clean-Out. What kind of repairs is the Contractor expected to handle, if the situation arises?

(Repairs expected are related to visible damage to the concrete within the berms once completely empty. (ex: chips, cracks, indentations)

- Please provide photos of each range drain.
- **(Drains will not be cleaned unless topical debris needs to be removed.)**
- Please clarify required licensing/permits: *The Contractor must have and retain necessary permits and/or licenses for proper lead removal and disposal.*
- **(Vendors must follow industry standard protocols)**
- Please clarify the anticipated work ours: *Availability - The Contractor must be available on weekends and evenings if needed.*

(Schedule and timing for routine cleaning services must be coordinated in advance with the Range Staff or designee. Due to the nature of the operational needs of the facility, the Contractor understands and agrees that it may be necessary to perform certain services during non-normal work hours, including evenings, weekends, and holidays.)

***Any results listed in this addendum are estimated quantities/prices based on past berm cleaning.**
